Year 4 have been working hard on perfecting balances and jumps this week, in PE. It was wonderful to see all the different ways children managed to demonstrate their ideas on a variety of apparatus. Fabulous teamwork was evident as children worked out how to balance with a partner. In science, the children were finding the answer to the question, ' Is there a link between the pitch of a sound and the object that produced it?' To answer the question the children used a glockenspiel and listened to the sound produced by bars of varying lengths. They then went on to play tunes, such as Baa Baa Black Sheep and Twinkle Twinkle Little Star to each other.

As well as all the hard work that takes place in classrooms, we are also on a continual drive for improvement behind the scenes. I'm delighted to say that after many months of work, we have two new projects ready to launch. The first is a redevelopment of The Zone, which will be starting on Monday. For this, we are converting the large space we currently have into three new teaching spaces, which will be so brilliant for us all! We have planned it carefully to minimise disruption, but please note that it will impact on parking at the front of the school. Where possible, we continue to encourage walking to school or lift sharing

to minimise the number of cars on site. The second project is due to begin around Easter, and will see the former pond area at the bottom of the playground transformed into a sensory garden, as planned by the children!
