YEAR 1 NEWS

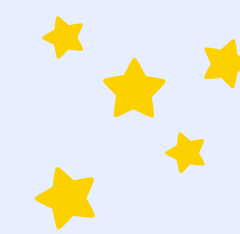
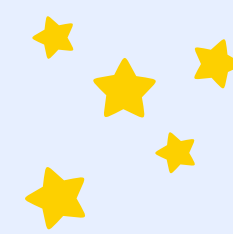
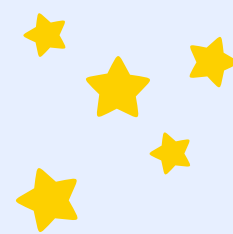
