Our topic this half term has been:

Reach for the Stars!

The Moon

We carried out an experiment to find out why there are craters on the moon. We dropped rocks onto a cornflour mixture to represent the meteors hitting the moon, and saw craters being created before our eyes!



Earth

We know that Earth is made up of land and sea, and that there are lots of different environments for the different animals and plants to live in. 



























































We had a great time celebrating VE Day! We learnt why we celebrate, and the importance of remembering those who fought in the wars.


We have been getting stuck into our Science learning this half-term. We are deepening our study of plants and living things around our school. We began our learning this half-term by splitting into teams and working to create fact files and posters about plants and what we thought people should know about them. This was a tremendous success and showcased our excellent scientific knowledge and amazing teamwork skills!

In our DT unit, we have been focusing on textiles. We have been making pin cushions, using the flowers around our school as inspiration. We have followed a brief to make a functional item, thinking about the purpose of an eye-catching design. We have practised our sewing skills using back stitch and blanket stitch.





Writing

We have been focusing on instructional writing this half term. We have looked at how to create a calm mind and the steps we can take to achieve this. As a part of our learning, we followed a set of instructions to make a paper boat. We used these to practise some calming breathing techniques.

History

In History this half-term, we have been looking at the effects of World War Two on our local area. We have looked at key figures, including Rudolf Hess and Anne Frank, using the Little People, Big Dreams books. We also celebrated the 80th anniversary of VE Day with a tea party.





Science

We have been developing our knowledge of plants this half-term.

We have explored what plants need to grow by carrying out an experiment that we can observe over time. We made predictions and discussed what made a fair test. We have also experimented to see how water travels through a plant.








Maths and Computing

In Maths, Year 4 have been focusing on decimal numbers and fractions. The confidence shown in converting fractions to decimals has been amazing. The children were able to demonstrate their understanding with concrete apparatus and pictorially. They used this knowledge to help with the addition and subtraction of money. Year 4 have also been working hard to learn all the times table facts, up to 12×12 , ready for the multiplication check in June.



In Computing, the children have been creating their own code, using Logo, to draw letters and shapes.









Keeping Active

Year 4 are a busy bunch and love to be active. They all put 100% effort into the fun run and were a credit to the class, with their stamina and can do attitude. Parachute games are always good fun and require the children to work together as one to enable to parachute move in the required way.

Science

Observation and enquiry skills were put to the test this half term, when the children carried out a unit on states of matter. The children demonstrated that they could use thermometers with accuracy. Data was recorded, then conclusions drawn, when responding to the question, 'What effect does the temperature of water have on the speed that ice melts?





















Creativity

The children in Year 4 can be so entertaining and creative, both on paper and in person. This was clearly demonstrated when they created and then performed a rap based on recycling. In Music, the children have been singing in rounds and learning about different ways in which songs can be structured for effect. In Art, the children have experimented with printing and collage to create a piece of art work to represent their time in Year 4.





challenge!

This half term, Year 5 have been learning lots about our History topic, the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings, through English lessons. We began by writing a setting description of a Saxon village including grammar features like fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases to make out descriptions more vivid. More recently, Miss Donald was very impressed with the fantastic newspaper reports on the Viking invasion of Lindisfarne—the children's work showcased their excellent historical knowledge and great understanding of relative clauses.

In Maths, our focus has been on numbers with decimal places. We've learnt how to compare decimals, add and subtract, and understand how they link to percentages and fractions. We've also been focussing on improving our fluency accuracy, when answering arithmetic and questions. The Key Stage 2 Demathlon was another great celebration of Maths,



In Science, we've been putting our practical skills to the test by planning and carrying out a number of investigations. In small groups, we designed experiments around thermal insulators, choosing our own question and thinking carefully about the method we'd need to carry out the investigation. In DT, we did an artist study of Anni Albers, a famous textile weaver. We've practised different weaving techniques and are looking forward to applying this learning to make a flower from different threads and a paper plate.





Another highlight of our half term has been our outdoor learning with Mrs Morgan! We've learnt important life skills like how to use a compass, how to read a key on a map and teamwork. We've also had a great time playing rounders to further develop our teamwork and to get our heart rates up!

We were lucky enough to take part in a Poetry Slam with Spoz, a published poet who delivers poetry workshops across the country. It was a lively, creative day, where children worked together to create and perform their own poems. The trip to the Hay Festival to hear Patrice Lawrence share the inspiration behind her storytelling and what it takes to be an author was also an exciting opportunity!



Year 6



This term has highlighted the remarkable efforts of our Year 6 children. This part of the year can often be quite challenging, especially with the SATs taking place, but our Year 6 cohort has truly risen to the occasion.

Throughout the last few weeks, it has been a joy to witness the students working hard, supporting one another, and embodying the role of outstanding role models for the rest of the school. They have really come together as a family, which has been evident during various events. From encouraging each other during the Mini Marathon to collectively celebrating VE Day, their camaraderie has shone brightly.

Most notably, during SATs week, each student demonstrated resilience and determination, and they all performed remarkably well. Their hard work and support for one another during this critical time has been nothing short of inspiring.








Hot Chocolate with the Head!

one of our favourite events.


Sport at KTPS

Pompom Butterflies

- 1. First, get 1 big pompom and 3 little pompoms and stick them all together.
- 2. Secondly, take paper plate and cut it into quarters and put some patterns with either pens or paint.
- 3. Thirdly, stick the back of your paper plates to the back of your pompoms.
- 4. Next, get some pipe cleaners and bend the top. Then, stick them to your pompoms.

5. Finally, get your paper plates from earlier and stick them to the back of your pompoms.

E Day Recipe Ingredients 200g (7oz) plain flour

- 405g can light condensed milk
- 2 eggs
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 150g (5½oz) margarine or butter
- 3 tsp baking powder
- 6 tbsp strawberry conserve or jam
- 200g (7oz) icing sugar
- 100g (3½oz) margarine or butter, softened
- 2tsp vanilla extract
- 200g (7oz) mixed summer berries

Method

- Preheat the oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4.
- 2. Place the flour, condensed milk, egg, vanilla extract, margarine and baking powder in a bowl and beat for 2-3 minutes until pale and fluffy.
- 3. Spoon into the tins and bake for approximately 25-30 minutes until springy to the touch and golden brown. Cool slightly and then transfer to a cooling rack to cool completely.
- 4. Place one half of the cake onto a serving plate and spread with the jam. Sandwich together with the other half.
- 5. Beat the icing sugar, butter and vanilla with a few drops of water to bring the mixture to a soft consistency. Spread onto the cake. Arrange the berries on top in a Union Jack shape.


