We will learn about new life and get to experience this first hand when we go to see some lambs being born on our Lambing Live trip!

- Go on a walk and see what new life you come across can you spot any blossom, or a baby animal?
- Go food shopping with your grown-ups and find out where different foods come from.

It is so important to create a love of reading from a young age - reading at home is a great way to support this. Remember that children's story books are changed as often as they are needed, with their reading books being changed every Tuesday and Friday. **Please hear your child read as often as possible and record it on BoomReader.** It is important to remember that children can read the same book two or three times before it is changed. This is how children are taught to read in phonics. Each time children read the same book, they will focus on a different area – sounding out, fluency, and comprehension.

PE will continue to be on **Tuesdays** with Miss Exley, and our Outdoor Learning Day will continue to be on **Thursdays** with Mrs Morgan. Please ensure that children come to school wearing weather appropriate kit.
