Ways to Extend Learning at Home

If you would like to do some learning at home, then below are a couple of fun and engaging ways you can do this, linked to our topic.

- Explore the History of Toys: Take some time to research different types of toys
 from various time periods and cultures. This could include visiting a local museum,
 watching documentaries, or reading books about the history of toys. Together, you
 can create a timeline or a scrapbook that highlights how toys have evolved over time
 and then bring it in to show the class.
- Create a Toy Project: Encourage your children to design and make their own toy, inspired by historical or traditional designs. Once complete, children can present their toy to the class, explaining the design and how it reflects the era or culture it was inspired by.

We would love to see any work your child completes at home! Please feel free to share their creations on **Seesaw**. It is always wonderful for the class to share in the learning of one another.

The Importance of Daily Reading

A gentle reminder about the crucial role of reading. Reading with your child every day is one of the most valuable ways to support their learning, language development, and confidence. Please make it part of your daily routine to read together and log your sessions on Boom Reader. These records help us monitor your child's progress and tailor support as needed. Weather and Appropriate Clothing





As the weather is now turning colder, please ensure that your child comes to school dressed in suitable, warm clothing. Layers, such as jumpers, coats, and hats, will keep them comfortable throughout the day, especially during outdoor play and activities. Labelling your child's clothing with their name is also crucial, as it helps us to return lost items promptly.

Morning Snacks

Your child will be offered a piece of fruit/veg each day. Alternatively you are welcome to send in a snack if you wish – this must be a piece of fruit or veg. Please also send in a labelled water bottle for your child to use throughout the day.

Wellies

In Year 1 we make the most of the outdoor space. Just as in Reception, we welcome a spare pair of named wellingtons in school, so that we can use the grounds appropriately.

At Kingstone and Thruxton, we do our very best to teach the children to look after their belongings, please help us by making sure that you label your child's shoes, wellies and clothing with their name. If you realise that anything is missing, please let us know as soon as possible so that we can locate and return it to you.

Tuesday is our PE day. We are continuing to keep the system where the children come into school in their PE kit and stay in their kit for the day. You may wish to send your child wearing black or navy jogging bottoms or leggings if the weather is cold. Similarly, the children will need school their jumper or hoodie over their PE t-shirt to make sure they are warm enough.

- Plain navy or white t-shirt
