BoomReader

Lots of children have been engaging with BoomReader and many have been reading at least 4 times a week - this is amazing! During this last half term, we are aspiring for all children to read at least 4 times a week and record this on BoomReader. If you have heard your child read, please make sure that it is logged so that their hard work at home can be celebrated in school. This could be a book from either home or school, If you are struggling to find a book that interests your child, please let me know and I will have a look with them. If you have any problems logging reading on BoomReader, please let me know.

This half term PE lessons will be on a Wednesday. Please ensure that children come to school dressed in PE kit. These lessons will take place outside so children will need to wear a sun hat and suncream on a Wednesday.
