This half term we completing the Crystal Star Challenge Unit as well as further developing netball skills. These sessions will be taught by Miss Exley on Tuesdays. The children will need to come to school in their P.E kits on a Tuesday.

Homework

A reminder that, in preparation for high school, children are set weekly homework.

This consists of:

- A 10-minute session on Times Table Rock Stars if children have 'gone green' and are fluent in all times tables, up to 12x12. For children who are still developing this knowledge, 10 minutes a day would support them further.
- Spellings are given out on a Monday and checked on a Friday.
- 4 sessions of 20-minute home reading, recorded on BoomReader
- 5 sessions of ReadTheory (this engagement can be logged on BoomReader.
- As we move towards SATs, I will be providing children with some maths revision questions to support them in improving their fluency.
